January 2020 Forestry Report

January forestry revolved around developing a forest management plan for Otsego County #8 Taylor Hill comprised of about 433 acres on Taylor Hill Road in the Town of Edmeston, NY. Property line identification and property corner identification took some time as not all lines and corners were marked. Several proved to be difficult to ascertain but with the use of Phone App Land glide I was able to find and mark these out. Experience with property lines also proved to be a deciding factor. Property lines are extremely important so one can work on the correct property! After property lines were put in, considerable work was employed in ARCGIS applications for planning inventory methodology. Extensive research into parcel mapping, identification, property line/boundary correlation, tax maps, forest stand delineation, inventory parameters, field inventory plot planning and location, and parcel history.

Field inventory was undertaken according to planning methodology. Trees that fell into plot radius (use of 10 factor wedge prism) were measured, species identified, and proper forest product class selected. Overall tree health, stand and site health, and other forest/site observations were noted and recorded for future use in prescription recommendations. Considerable office work then ensued with detailed statistical analysis of six forest stands visited, all by hand. Considerable work remains to be done on at least 22 more stands.

I wrote a newspaper article on having a forest management plan merits for private landowners and await direction from the manager as to which publication (s) he wishes me to approach. Wrote the December Forestry report, and wrote an analysis of last summer's timber sale on Otsego County #6 parcel. Forestry Friday featured two brief writings: the first on posting of private lands and the second on blazing property line trees. Both included pictures that were relevant to the subject matter.

During the last week the county highway dept. furnished a Ford Ranger for my use as a nonpermanent mode of transportation until the other larger Ford is repaired. I wrote an appraisal of the vehicle with concerns given to management.
